

# East Asian Studies Major Capstone Enrollment Form

## EAST 4991 East Asian Studies Capstone

To satisfy the capstone requirement in East Asian Studies, students must demonstrate a degree of proficiency in their East Asian target language – Chinese, Japanese, Korean or Tibetan – in a final paper written for a course of their choice. Because completion of the capstone requirement demands advanced language proficiency, it is strongly recommended that students take their capstone course in the spring semester of their final year.

**Students must enroll in TWO courses at the same time to fulfill the capstone requirement:**

- 1) **Any 3000-level non-language course, the content of which is concerned with some part of East Asia, and that requires a final paper.**

The consent of the instructor is required before the course can be used for this purpose. [See point 2]

- 2) **The one-credit East Asian Studies Capstone EAST4991.**

This class does not require any attendance or assignment, but fulfills the extra language requirement for the final paper. Enrollment for this course is restricted to “Instructor Permission Only,” and is subject to the same add/drop regulations as other courses. Enrollment must be approved by the East Asian Studies Major Advisor. To this end, both the instructor of the course being used for capstone and the Major advisor need to sign this form **by the first week of classes**. You are encouraged to seek approval before the beginning of term.

**The student will not be able to graduate without fulfilling this requirement.**
